8. What were the cities of refuge and where else in the OT are they mentioned (6:57, 67)?
9. Where else in the OT are the daughters of Zelophehad mentioned and what did they request (7:15)?
10. What is Joshua the son of Nun known for (7:27)?
11. Why is the genealogical information of 8:29-38 repeated in 9:35-44?
12. When are the individuals listed in 9:3-34 living in Jerusalem, before or after the Babylonian Captivity (compare with Nehemiah 11)?
13. What is Phinehas known for (9:20)?

Applications for Today

1. When we do the service of the Lord it must be done by his commandment (6:49; Col. 3:17).
2. Mighty men of valor are still needed today to go forth to war and fight our spiritual battles (7:2, 5, 7, 9, 11, 40; 1 Cor. 16:13; Eph. 6:10-18).
3. Women can do great things if they put their minds to it (7:24; Prov. 31:10).
4. God punishes his people for their transgressions (9:1; Heb. 2:2-3).
5. Very able men are still needed today for the service of the house of God (9:13; 2 Tim. 2:2).
