7. What five closing admonitions did Paul give the Corinthians (16:13-14)?
8. What was the house of Stephanus known for (16:15-18)?
9. Who sent their greetings (salutations) to the Corinthians and how were the Corinthians to greet each other (1 Cor. 16:19-20)?

10. What did Paul write in his closing remarks about the man who did not love the Lord, about Jesus, and about himself (16:21-23)?

1. What can be learned about the collection from 2 Corinthians 8-9?
2. What does "maranatha" mean (16:22)?
• Applications for Today
1. Christians are supposed to offer a portion of their income into the collection each Sunday (16:1-2). What kind of giver does God want (2 Cor. 9:6-7)?
2. When God opens doors of opportunity to teach others the gospel we need to walk through those doors and teach others (16:9). What kind of "doors" does God open for people (Acts 14:27; 2 Cor. 2:12; Col. 4:3; Rev. 3:8)?
3. It is good for us to be busy doing the Lord's work like Timothy (16:10). What admonition did Paul give the Corinthians regarding the Lord's work (1 Cor. 15:58)?
4. Paul's five closing admonitions are important for us today (16:13-14). When is a good time to be watchful (Mt. 25:13; 26:41; Acts 20:30-31; 1 Thess. 5:6; 1 Pet. 5:8; Rev. 3:2)? Why is it important to stand fast (Gal. 5:1; Phil. 1:27; 2 Thess. 2:15)? Why is it important to act mature like men (1 Cor. 14:20)? When is it important to be strong (Eph. 6:10-11)? What are Christians to do in love (Eph. 3:17; 4:2, 15, 16; 5:2; Col. 2:2; 1 Thess. 5:13)?
