• Applications for Today

- As stewards of God's gifts (talents), we need to be faithful (trustworthy) in our use of God's gifts (4:1-2). How are Christians to use the gifts that God gives them (1 Pet. 4:10)?
- 2. It doesn't matter how others judge us, or even how we judge ourselves, but how the Lord judges us (4:3-5). Why do Christians need to live faithfully before the Lord and not sin willfully (Heb. 10:30)?
- 3. We must never go beyond what is written in the scriptures (4:6). What is the Christian's spiritual boundary line and what happens when he goes beyond it (2 Jn. 9-11)?
- 4. We must never be puffed up or arrogant (4:6, 18-19). What causes a person to be puffed up (1 Cor. 5:2; 8:1) and what keeps a person from being puffed up (1 Cor. 13:4)?
