Applications for Today

1. Moral pollution exists in the world and in the church because people are guilty of transgressing, violating, and breaking God's law, statute, and covenant (24:5-6; 2 Chron. 36:14; Psa. 106:38; Jer. 16:18).

2. The Lord can cause the noise of the merry-making among worldly people to cease when he judges them (24:7-13; Rev. 18:22).

3. It is good to lift up the voice in praise of the Lord's majesty and glory (24:14-16; 2 Chron. 5:13; Acts 4:24).

4. We need to be moved emotionally over the sinfulness of mankind and the Lord's judgment upon that sin (24:16; Isa. 15:5; 16:9-11; 21:3-4; 22:4; Lk. 19:41; Heb. 10:31; 12:29).

5. Transgression and sin will cause a person to fall spiritually (24:20; Psa. 5:10; Prov. 29:16).

6. The Lord should be praised for all his wonderful acts and counsels (25:1-5; Eph. 1:3-14).
7. The Lord's mountain (restored Jerusalem and later the church) is a place of blessing and joy without darkness, death, tears, or reproach (25:6-8; Isa. 2:2-4; 11:9; 27:13; 30:29; 56:7; 57:13; 65:9, 25; 66:20).
8. There will be no tears or death in heaven (25:8; Rev. 7:17; 21:4).
9. All those who wait upon the Lord will be saved (25:9; Gen. 49:18; Psa. 25:5; 62:1; Prov. 20:22; Isa. 33:2; 51:5; Lam. 3:26; Mic. 7:7; Heb. 9:28).
