## **Applications for Today**

- 1. Alcohol (strong drink) causes people to err in their judgment, their words, and their actions (28:7-8; Prov. 20:1; 23:20-21, 29-32).
- 2. God offers the people a message of rest and refreshment, but some people don't want to hear it (28:12; Mt. 11:28-30).
- 3. Jesus is the foundation stone that is laid in Zion and anyone can believe in him if he desires to (28:16; Rom. 9:33; 10:11; 1 Pet. 2:6).
- 4. The Lord is wonderful in counsel and excellent in wisdom (28:29; Rom. 11:33).
- People who do not want to serve the Lord faithfully will not search for truth nor will they understand the Lord's word (29:9-12; Mt. 13:11-15; 2 Thess. 2:9-12). On the other hand, the humble people who do serve the Lord will understand (29:18-19, 24; Mt. 5: 3-6; 11:5).
- 6. We must be careful in our religion that we do not say we honor the Lord while having a heart that is far removed from serving him (29:13; Mt. 15:8-9; Mk. 7:6-7).
- 7. We cannot hide from God who made us (29:15-16; Psa. 139:1-16; Heb. 4:13).
- 8. The Lord's children need to sanctify the Lord and stand in awe of him (29:23; Heb. 12:28-29).
