7. How are the sinners in Zion described and what question do they ask (33:13-14)?
8. What answer is given to their question (33:15-16)?
9. What do the righteous see and not see in days to come (33:17-19)?
10. What do the righteous see when they behold Jerusalem in days to come (33:20-21)?

11. What is the Lord to the righteous (33:22)?
12. How are the present and future conditions of the people described (33:23-24)?
13. Who does Isaiah call to come and hear (34:1)?
14. What does the Lord have against the nations and what happens to them (34:2-4)?
15. What nation does the Lord draw his sword of judgment against and what happens to it (34:5-7)?
16. What happens to the land of Edom in the Lord's day of vengeance (34:8-15)?
17. What counsel does Isaiah give the people concerning the Lord's judgment upon the nations (34:16-17)?
18. What description is given of the future land of Israel (35:1-2)?
19. What happens in the future to the weak and fearful of heart (35:3-4)?
20. What happens in the future to the blind, the deaf, the lame, and the mute (35:5-6)?
21. What kind of highway is made, who travels this highway, and where does this highway lead (35:7-10)?

1. Where else in the book of Isaiah do we find reference to the host of heaven being moved as a result of God's judgment (34:4)?

## **Applications for Today**

1. We need to ask the Lord to be gracious and to be our salvation (33:2; 1 Pet. 2:3).
2. Those who fear the Lord will receive stability, abundance of salvation, wisdom, and knowledge (33:6; Eph. 1:17; Col. 1:9).
3. Sinners live in fear while the righteous dwell in security (33:13-16; 2 Pet. 1:10).
4. The Lord is our judge, lawgiver, and king and by these three roles he saves us (33:22; Jas. 4:12).
5. When you seek out the book of the Lord and read, you will find that all of God's word comes to pass (34:16; Mt. 24:15).
6. The Lord provides a highway of holiness for the ransomed and redeemed to come to him (35:8-10; Gal. 3:13; 1 Pet. 1:18).
