Applications for Today

- 1. The Lord supports those who wait for him, rejoice in him, and work righteousness (64:4-5; Acts 10:35).
- 2. Sin makes us unclean and causes the Lord to be angry with us and to turn away from us (64:5-7; Rom. 1:18; 6:19; Eph. 2:1-4; 5:6; Col. 3:6; 1 Jn. 1:5-9).
- 3. We need to plead to the Lord for forgiveness of our sin (64:9; Lk. 18:13).
- 4. There are seeking Gentiles who come to the Lord and there are rebellious Jews who do not come to the Lord (65:1-2; Rom. 10:20-21).
- 5. It is important to answer when the Lord calls, listen when he speaks, and choose what he delights in (65:12; Prov. 1:24; 1 Sam. 3:10).
- 6. Those who seek the Lord are blessed and those who forsake the Lord are cursed (65:13-16; Mt. 25:34, 41).
- 7. God is a God of truth (65:16; Rom. 1:25; 2:2).
- 8. The eternal destiny of the righteous in heaven is described as a "new heaven and new earth" (65:17; 66:22; 2 Pet. 3:13; Rev. 21:1-2).
- 9. There will be no more weeping or crying in heaven (65:19; Rev. 7:17; 21:4).
- 10. The Lord is not confined to a physical temple (66:1-2; Acts 7:48-50; 17:24).
- 11. The Lord is looking for the person who is humble and trembles at his word (66:2; Ezra 9:4; 10:3; Psa. 119:120, 161; Mt. 5:3; 1 Pet. 5:6-7).
- 12. The Lord sees the hypocrisy of his sinful people and punishes it (66:3-4; Mt. 6:2, 5, 16; 7:5; 15:7; 22:18; 23:13ff).
- 13. All faithful Christians are priests to the Lord (66:21; 1 Pet. 2:5-10; Rev. 1:6; 5:10; 20:6).
- 14. All flesh, both Jews and Gentiles, can come to worship the Lord and be saved (66:23; Lk. 3:6; Acts 20:21; Rom. 9:24; 10:12).
- 15. Those who transgress against the Lord will suffer eternal punishment in the judgment day (66:24; Mk. 9:44-48; Rev. 14:11; Rev. 20:10).
