Sixth, remove any sin and shame (Genesis 2:25; 3:7-10).

Seventh, continue your courtship (Ecclesiastes 9:9).

Eighth, speak and treat each other respectfully (Proverbs 12:4; 31:11-12, 28).

Ninth, guard your sexual thoughts toward others (Exodus 20:14,17; Proverbs 2:16-17; 6:24-29; Hebrews 13:4).

Tenth, take your roles seriously and fulfill them faithfully (Ephesians 5:22-33; I Timothy 5:14; Titus 2:4-5; I Peter 3:1-7).

Eleventh, pray together regularly (1 Peter 3:7).

Twelfth, avoid unnecessary nagging and fault-finding (Colossians 3:19; Proverbs 21:19; 27:15).

Lastly, keep God and Christ at the center of your marriage (Psalm 127:1; Matthew 7:24). Marriage is indeed honorable, so let's work to keep it that way.

Marriage Is Honorable

Let marriage be had in honor among all, and let the bed be undefiled: for fornicators and adulterers God will judge - Hebrews 13:4 -

The current state of marriage in the United States is in decline. Marriage has fallen on hard times. There are many people who refuse to get married because they think it is a hinderance to their life. Sex without marriage is also very popular (births to unmarried woman is now around 39% in this country).

Other people engage in shortterm co-habitation or marriage. Some have extra-marital affairs and many get divorces. The divorce rate in this country is around 50%.

When marriage problems arise, many turn to spouse abuse, divorce, or even murder. Many do not know where to turn for help or how to cope with their marital problems.

Others do not want to do the hard work and make the sacrifice it takes to maintain a godly marriage.

What Should Couples Do?

Let's consider a few things taken from God's word that couples can do to keep their marriage the way God wants it to be.

First, remember that God joined you two in marriage, not just the state (Genesis. 2:18-24; Matthew 19:6,26). God wants you to stay together even though man does not.

Second, remember that marriage is good and honorable even though many Americans do not believe that (Proverbs 18:22; 19:14; Hebrews 13:4).

Third, resolve among yourselves that divorce is not an option (Malachi 2:14-16; Matthew 5:32; 19:3-9; Mark 10:1-12; Luke 16:18; Romans 7:2-3; I Corinthians 7:10-11,39). A divorce without the proper cause (for fornication), is a violation God's law and any remarriage after such a divorce is adultery.

Fourth, establish your own home and do not let the in-laws interfere to the point of causing problems (Genesis 2:24).

Fifth, focus on pleasing each other (Genesis 2:24; Deuteronomy 24:5; Proverbs 5:15-20; I Corinthians 7:3-7,34).
