be daily fixed, secure, stable, and confident. Confidence blesses the Christian in three ways:

First, confidence about the <u>past</u> – forgiveness of sins (Hebrews 10:22). Second, confidence about the <u>present</u> – hope (Hebrews 6:18) and answered prayer (1 John 5:14-15). Third, confidence about the <u>future</u> – a reward in heaven (1 Corinthians 5:1).

Confident That You Are Saved

How can the Christian have confidence hat he/she is saved? The book of First John is a good place to go to answer this question. John writes that if a Christian walks in the light (1:5-7), confesses sins (1:8-2:2), keeps Jesus' commandments (2:3-6), loves the brethren (3:14-15; 4:11-13; 5:2), does not love the world (2:15-17; 5:4-5), confesses Christ each day (2:18ff; 4:1-3,15-17; 5:13), practices righteousness (3:4-10), has a pure conscience (3:18-22), let's the Holy Spirit's word dwell in them (3:24; 4:13), and, listens to the Apostles (I In. 4:4-6), that Christian can be confident.

One thing that is greatly needed today in our ever-changing world is confidence. The Christian needs a strong sense of security, boldness, and confidence that he/she is doing what is right in the sight of God and that he/she knows the truth.

A Christian needs to be very careful in today's world. The confidence of a Christian can actually be "cast away" (Hebrews 10:35). A Christian can slowly lose his/her confidence in all that is good, right, and true. Instead of trust, reliance, certainty, assurance, and security, a Christian starts having weariness, doubt, wickedness, and restlessness (Isaiah 57:20-21).

Confidence Possibilities

When it comes to having confidence, there are a few possibilities. Some people have...

 No confidence. These people are not in a right relationship with God and so they have no hope of being saved (Ephesians 2:12).

- False confidence. These people are religious and they talk right about Jesus, but they are not doing what Jesus says so they are going to be lost (Matthew 7:21-23).
- Little confidence. These people are overwhelmed by the stresses and strains of life and they lose sight of Jesus and start "sinking" in the worldly problems around them (Matthew 14:31).
- Genuine confidence. These people are right with God through Jesus Christ and are living the faithful Christian life each day (Hebrews 10:22).

Confidence Properly Grounded

To be confident means to be grounded and stable. A person is confident when one is completely sure and certain about his/her standing before God. Any confidence, to be real, has to be properly grounded on the firm foundation of truth.

Our confidence is <u>not</u> to be placed in things like...

- The flesh or human accomplishments (Philippians 3:3-5).
- Self-righteous acts that we think we

need to do (Philippians 3:6-9).

- The subjective feelings we have within ourselves.
- The false doctrines of men that are not according to the truth of God's word (Calvinism, reincarnation, latter-day revelation, etc.)
- Attendance at a church service. (Note: While attendance is important, Hebrews 10:24-25, attendance alone is not enough.)

While our confidence should not be placed in these things, it should be place in ...

- Our faith in Jesus and obedience to him (Ephesians 3:12).
- Christ's ability to guard our commitment to him (2 Timothy 1:12).
- Christ's promises of spiritual blessings now and in heaven in the judgment day (2 Peter 1:4).

Confidence Brings Blessings

It is so important for the Christian to maintain confidence in an everchanging world. The Christian needs to
