For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to the flesh, for the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh, but divinely powerful for the destruction of fortresses.

- 2 Corinthians 10:3-4 -

Let's talk about heaven for a little bit. Why talk about heaven? It is good to talk about heaven in times of trouble. Jesus talked about heaven on the night of his betrayal (John 14:1-3). It is good to talk about heaven in times of worldliness. Paul wrote about heaven to Christians who needed to keep their minds off the world around them (Philippians 3:20; Colossians 3:1-3). It is good to talk about heaven in times of loss. Paul wrote about heaven to Christians who had lost their loved-ones to death (1 Thessalonians 4:17).

It is good to talk about heaven in times of death. Paul wrote to Timothy before his own death and encouraged Timothy to stay faithful (2 Timothy 4:6-8). It is good to talk about heaven in times of persecution. The writer of Hebrews wrote about heaven to Christians who were falling under the wait of persecution (Hebrews 13:14).

#### **Consider Who Will Be There**

Why should we all want to go to heaven? We should all want to go because of who will be there. God (Revelation 4:2), Jesus (Revelation 5:6; 22:1), and the Holy Spirit will be there (Revelation 1:4-5). The holy angels (Luke 15:7,10), the Old Testament

righteous will be there (Matthew 8:11; Heb. 11:40; 12:23). The New Testament righteous will be there (Luke 10:20; Philippians 4:3). All who truly love the Lord will be there (2 Timothy 4:8). All the little innocent children will be there (Matthew 19:13-14). All who were committed to Jesus will be there (Revelation 2:10; 6:9; 7:14; 14:12-13). What an awesome crowd to be with!



#### Consider Why We Will Be There

Why should we all want to go to heaven? We should want to go because of why we will be there. We will be in heaven to praise and serve God for all eternity (Revelation 14:1-5; 15:2-3; 22:3) and to be rewarded with rest for overcoming (1 Peter 1:4; Revelation 2:7,11,17,26; 3:5,12,21; 7:13-17; 14:12-13).

#### Consider What Will Be There

Why should we all want to go to heaven? We should all want to go to heaven because it is a place of beauty – paradise (Revelation 21:10; 22:14). We should want to go because it is a place of rest (Hebrews 4:11; Revelation 14:13), a place of joy and comfort: no sickness, sorrow, pain, or death (Revelation 21:4), a place of righteousness: no uncleanness (Revelation 20:11-15; 21:7-8,27; 22:14-15), and a place of eternity (Revelation 22:5,14).

# Consider Why We Want to Go to Heaven

Why should we all want to go to heaven? We should all want to go to heaven because the only alternative is **HELL** (Matthew 7:13). We should all want to go because God wants me to go (2 Pet. 3:9), because loved-ones want me to go (Revelation 22:17), and because many who want to go will not make it (Matthew 7:21-23).

Can you rejoice that your name is written in heaven (Luke 10:20)? If we miss heaven, we miss all there is! Let's all obey the gospel and live faithfully each day so that we can go to heaven.
