Jesus and "Roots"

"Then His disciples came and said to Him, Do You know that the Pharisees were offended when They heard this saying? But He answered and said, Every plant which My heavenly Father has not planted will be uprooted. Let them alone. They are blind leaders of the blind. And if the blind leads the blind, both will fall into a ditch." (Matthew 15:12-13)

Many times folks get upset when you show a teaching of man to be false in light of what the scripture says. They don't want (or like) false teaching to be exposed and condemned. "Preach the truth and leave error alone", they say. Jesus both taught what was right and condemned what was wrong (Mt. 15:3-9). It's Kind of Like Sin

to pay for that "fun".

Remember what Solomon said to the one tempted to go to the harlot? "Now therefore, my sons, hearken unto me, And attend to the words of my mouth. Let not thy heart decline to her ways; Go not astray in her paths. For she hath cast down many wounded: Yea, all her slain are a mighty host. Her house is the way to Sheol, Going down to the chambers of death" (Proverbs 7:24-27). In the previous verses Solomon described how good she looked and how good she sounded, but it would costs him his soul!

God's Grace: You Can Get Back Up

The blessing of the Gospel of God's grace is that the blood of Jesus can atone for all and any sin. In I Corinthians 6:9-11, Paul lists several sins that the Corinthians had been cleansed from by the sanctification in the Lord Jesus Christ. Some had been fornicators and adulterers, but they had been "washed" by the blood of Jesus on the cross (1:18).

This blessing however, comes with responsibility. As Christians, we have a responsibility to walk in the light of God's word, not walk in darkness. We can't keep running down the hill of the pleasures of sin and expect the Lord to "pick us up" so we can go down again! As Paul said, "What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin, that

grace may abound? God forbid. We who died to sin, how shall we any longer live therein? Or are ye ignorant that all we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him through baptism unto death: that like as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we also might walk in newness of life" (Romans 6:1-4).

Those participating in the "newness of life" don't look to the pleasures of sin but to the love of the ways of the Lord. They know that true living and true joy come by walking in the light and the paths of righteousness. - Steve Reeves
