Are you too sensitive? I wish more brethren were like the Canaanitish woman who came to Jesus in Matthew 15:21-28. She wanted Jesus to heal her demonpossessed daughter. At first, both Jesus and his disciples dismissed her, but she persisted until Jesus granted her request. She didn't get "hurt feelings" when Jesus wouldn't answer her at first or when the disciples wanted to send her away.

Let me encourage us all to be a little less sensitive and a little more attune to living faithfully each day. — *Chris Reeves*

Man Is Not To Be A Fool

Mankind is a rational being, not a brute beast. Man is not a "highly evolved animal" as atheistic scientists suggest. Man is the only rational being made in the image of God (Genesis 1:26-27). As such, we are all responsible before God to act reasonably and rationally (Romans 12:1-2). God wants us to use our mind to think carefully and critically about life's questions and issues. God wants us to live and die wisely, not foolishly.

To act rationally is to act according to God's truth; to act according to reality; to act wisely; and, to act for man's well-being. What man calls "wise" today, God calls "foolish" and what man calls "foolish" today, God calls "wise"!

The Death of a Fool

In the scripture quoted above, King David did not want Abner, the commander of Saul's army, to die the death of a fool. What is the death of a fool? In the case of Abner, it is a death with-

out honor (2 Sam. 3:33). In Proverbs 10:21, the death of a fool is the death of one who dies without understanding God's word. In Ecclesiastes 7:17, the death of a fool is the death of one who dies before the proper time (an untimely death).

Who Is A Fool?

In the Old Testament, a fool (Hebrew nabal) is one who is "senseless;" stupid; especially of the man who has no perception of ethical and religious claims. In the New Testament, a fool (Greek aphron) is one who is literally "without the mind;" without reason, without thinking, and senseless. In the Bible then, a "fool" is one who does not use his or her mind to reason with or understand God's word and then follow God's word.

Dying As A Fool Dies

When it comes time to die - and we are all appointed a time to die (Hebrews 9:27) - how will you die? Will you die the death of a fool? Let's take a look at how a fool dies.

A fool dies while renouncing God. This is what Job's wife wanted Job to do; curse God and die (Job 1:10; 2:10). A fool dies an unbeliever. The fool says there is no God and he goes to his grave an atheist

(Psalm 14:1; Romans 1:20-23).

A fool dies uncaring about sin. He goes to his grave and faces God in judgment with unforgiven sin (Proverbs 14:9). A fool dies after repeating the same old folly. He returns to the same old sins and mistakes over and over again all the while hurting himself and others (Proverbs 26:11).

A fool dies while trusting self. He does not turn to God (Proverbs 28:26). A fool dies while neglecting the "inside" of his heart. He does not care that God is looking at his "inside" heart to see if it is right (Luke 11:38-40; 1 Samuel 16:7; 1 Kings 8:39; Hebrews 4:13).

A fool dies unprepared for the judgment day (Mt. 25:1ff; Lk. 12:21), not accepting the resurrection (1 Cor. 15:36). A fool dies a boaster (Acts 12:20-23) and ignorant (1 Peter 2:15).

Friend, Satan wants you to die a fool. Think! Use your head! The Apostle Paul wrote: "Look therefore carefully how ye walk, not as unwise, but as wise; redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Wherefore be ye not foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is" (Ephesians 5:15-17). - Chris Reeves
