Heart - continued

- The emotion of the heart is focused on Christ and his church (Acts 2:46; 4:32; Romans 9:2; 10:1; Ephesians 5:19; 6:5; Colossians 3:16,22)
- The will of the heart is governed by Christ (2 Corinthians 9:7; Colossians 3:15; 2 Thessalonians 3:5).
- The conscience of the heart is not hardened (Hebrews 3:8 – 4:7), but is assured (1 John 3:19-21).

Your Heart, the Devil, and God

You know what is in your heart and God knows what is in your heart (Luke 16:15; Hebrews 4:12; Revelation 2:23). The Devil wants to rob your heart (Matthew 13:19; Lk. 8:12) and deceive your heart (Romans 16:18). So, guard your heart will all diligence (Proverbs 4:23). Guard your intellect, emotions, will, and conscience.

The Heart of Mankind

The Apostle Peter writes about "the hidden man of the heart" in I Peter 3:4. Here, the word "heart" is used in a figurative sense to refer to the center and seat of one's spiritual life - one's mind, soul, or spirit.

The heart of man functions in different ways (Matthew 9:4; 24:48; Mark 2:6,8; Hebrews 4:12). In this article, we will study how the heart of mankind functions and what role the heart plays in one's salvation from sin.

The Heart: Intellect

The heart of mankind is one's intellect where one thinks, reasons, analyzes, imagines, ponders, understands, and believes.

The heart's thinking must not be evil (Matthew 9:4; 12:34,35; 15:18-19; Mark 2:6,8). The heart's understanding must be open to truth (Matthew 13:15). The heart's thinking must be

fully persuaded (Mark 11:23). The heart's belief must be fully convinced of Jesus Christ (Luke 24:25,38).

The Heart: Emotion

The heart of mankind is also one's emotion where one has feelings (positive or negative), affections, desires, and trust.

The heart's feelings must be kept pure (Matthew 5:8,28). The heart's feelings must be genuine toward God (Matthew 15:8; 22:37). The heart's feelings must be forgiving (Matthew 18:35).

The Heart: Will

Additionally, the heart of mankind is one's will where one purposes, decides, determines, intends, and obeys.

The heart's purpose must be on heaven with a will that desires to go there (Matthew 6:21; Luke 12:34; 21:34).

The Heart: Conscience

Lastly, the heart of mankind is one's conscience where one contemplates right and wrong, and where one condemns himself or commends himself (Romans 2:15).

The heart's conscience must not grow

hard (Matthew 13:15; Mark 3:5; 6:52; John 12:40). The heart's conscience must not be evil (Matthew 24:48; Titus 1:15; Hebrews 10:22). The heart's conscience must be honest (Luke 8:15).

Your Heart and Salvation

You will have to use your heart in becoming a Christian.

- The intellect of the heart believes the gospel (Acts 8:37; 15:9; 16:4; 28:27; Romans 10:17).
- The emotion of the heart turns toward loving God (John 14:15).
- The will of the heart repents and obeys God (Acts 3:19; 11:23; Romans 16:17).
- The conscience of the heart is pricked and cleansed in baptism (Acts 2:37; Hebrews 9:14; 10:22; 1 Peter 3:21).

You will have to use your heart to live as a faithful Christian.
