Context Is Everything

 "Context" is not just for Bible study, but for any form of communication, reading or hearing

 "Context" is not just for Bible study, but for every aspect of life

 We don't like it when people take our words out of context


• We should give the same care to God's word (2 Tim. 2:15)

 A text apart from its context is simply a pretext for a proof text (Mt. 4:6)

 To remove a passage from its context is to distort its meaning and to destroy ourselves (2 Pet. 3:16)

"Context" = a text with (con) a text

 The text above and below the text you are studying



Linguistic context


 What is the meaning of the original Heb. or Gr. word(s) under discussion in this text?

 Look up the words in Heb. or Gr. lexicons/word studies references

Linguistic context

 Compare English translations and be careful not to interpret a passage based upon one contemporary English meaning (Acts 8:38)



Pericope context

• What is the meaning of this text in the setting within the words around it; what is said in the paragraph, the chapter, and the book (1 Cor. 13:10)?

Note carefully what is <u>not</u> said




Genre context

• What kind of literature is being read: literal, figurative, poetic, prophetic, apocalyptic, epistle, narrative, etc.?

Genre contexts

 Words should be taken in their normal, literal sense, unless the context shows that the author is using some non-literal figure of speech (Rev. 1:1)




Historical context

 What, if any, is the cultural/societal, historical, or geographical setting of the text?

Who is speaking and to whom (Jn. 16:13)?

Historical context

- Who wrote it and to whom?
- When and where was it written?
- Why was it written?
- What is the purpose of the writing?
- How was it written?



Biblical context

• What is the overall message of the Bible and how does this particular passage fit into it (book(s), covenant, ages, the Bible as a whole)?

Biblical context

 Let scripture interpret (explain) scripture!

 Do not interpret a Bible passage in a way that would contradict another passage (Acts 20:27)

Biblical context

Recommend: Cross-reference Bible

 Recommend: "The Treasury of Scripture Knowledge"

Why out of context?
