

Hezekiah A Loyal King

"HE TRUSTED IN THE LORD, THE GOD OF ISRAEL..."

2 KINGS 18:5

Hezekiah: The King Who Trusted

- 2 Kings 18-20; 2 Chron. 29-32; Isa. 36-39
- ► A good king of Judah, the 12th, who reigned 29 years beginning at age 25 (715-686 B.C.)
- ► He is known for his trust (2 Kings 18:5)

Hezekiah: The King Who Trusted

- ► Trust in time of apostasy
- Trust in time of war
- ► Trust in time of sickness

Your Trust Will Be Tested

- ► His trust led to reform and restoration in time of apostasy (2 K. 18:3-8; 2 Chron. 29-31; see 29:3; 29:31; 29:36; 30:10-12; 31:20 32:1)
- He repaired and sanctified the temple, offered sacrifices for sin, kept the Passover, removed idolatry, restored the priesthood

Your Trust Will Be Tested

- ► His trust led to relying upon God in time of war (2 K. 18:9 19:37; 2 Chron. 32:1-23; Isa. 36-37; see 2 Chron. 32:7-8; 32:20-23)
- He paid tribute to S., fortified the city, encouraged the people, reminded the people of God's greatness, and he (along with Isaiah) prayed to God for help

Rabshakeh's Tactics

In 701 B.C., Rabshakeh challenged, threatened, and tested Judah's trust (2 K. 18:19-35; 19:8-13; 2 Chron. 32:9-19; Isa. 36:4-20; 37:8-13)

Rabshakeh's Tactics

- Questioning (causing doubt)
- Boasting (blaspheming)
- Agreeing
- Persisting
- Writing
- Railing
- Frightening

Your Trust Will Be Tested

- ► His trust led to prayer to God in times of sickness (2 K. 20:1-21; 2 Chron. 32:24-33; Isa. 38:1 – 39:8)
- ► He prayed for health (age 39, 701 B.C.), got well, wrote a song (Isa. 38:9-32), got proud, humbled himself, was tested

Who/what do you trust in?

- Fortified walls (Deut. 28:52; Jer. 5:17)
- ► Riches (Psa. 49:6; 52:7; Prov. 11:28; Mk. 10:24)
- Perverseness (Isa. 30:12; 47:10; 59:4)
- Military powers (Isa. 31:1; Psa. 20:7; 44:6)

Who/what do you trust in?

- Nations (Jer. 2:37)
- Friends (Psa. 41:9; Mic. 7:5)
- ► Idols (Psa. 115:18; 135:18; Isa. 42:17; Hab. 2:18)

Who/what do you trust in?

- ▶ Political leaders (Psa. 146:3)
- ► Selves (Prov. 28:26; Lk. 18:9; 2 Cor. 1:9)
