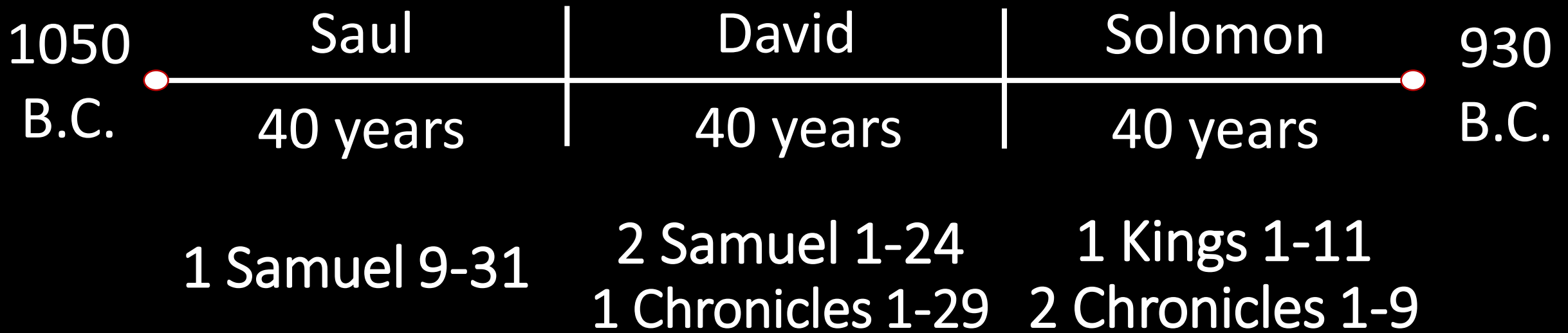

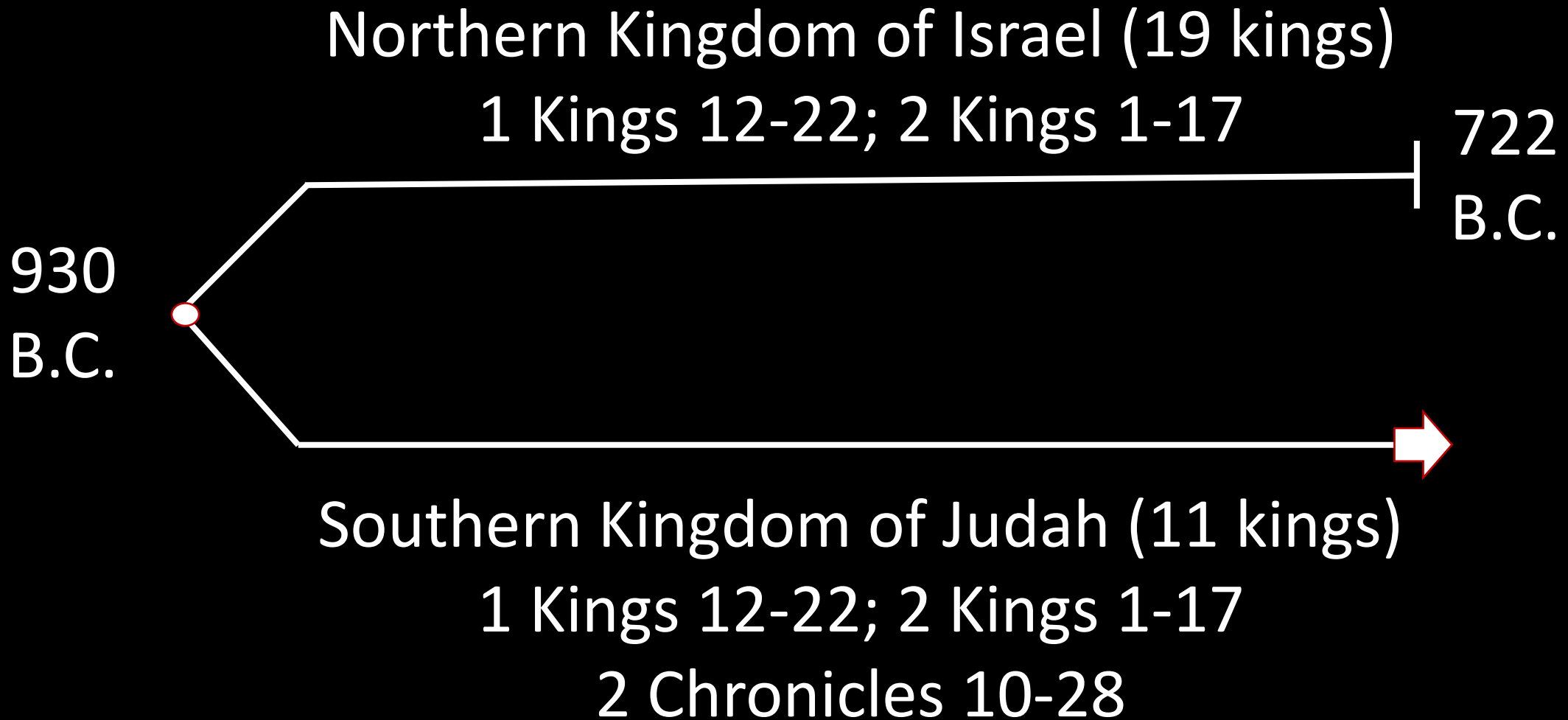
# The Period of the Kings in Three Sections

# Applications for Today

1. Don't follow the wicked influence and example of your forefathers (2 K. 23:32, 37; 24:9, 19; Ezek. 18:1-32).
2. God's people are judged according to their works (2 K. 24:3-4; Rom. 2:6; 2 Cor. 11:15; 2 Tim. 4:14; Rev. 2:23; 18:6; 20:12-13).
3. God gets angry at sin and so should we (2 K. 24:20; 1 K. 8:46; Psa. 36:4; Rom. 12:9).

# Applications for Today

4. Rebellion leads to trouble, so humble yourself before God (2 Chron. 36:12-13; Jer. 44:10; Dan. 5:22).
5. Pride leads to destruction and a haughty spirit leads to a fall (2 Chron. 36:12; Prov. 16:18).
6. Spiritual leaders should be pure (2 Chron. 36:14; 1 Tim. 3:1-13; 4:12).

# Applications for Today

7. Listen and obey God's word; don't mock it (2 Chron. 36:15-16; Heb. 12:25).
8. God brings final judgment and punishment on his people for three reasons: poor spiritual leadership (2 Chron. 36:11-12; 2 K. 17:1-6, 8, 19-23), worldliness among the people (2 Chron. 36:14; 2 K. 17:7-12, 14-18), and refusal to hear God's repeated warnings (2 Chron. 36:15-16; 2 K. 17:13).

# Applications for Today

9. God's word will always be fulfilled and come to pass (2 Chron. 36:21; Mt. 5:18; 24:35; 1 Pet. 2:25).
