



A Kingdom Divides

- 1. Israel's request (1 K. 12:1-5)
- 2. Counselors' recommendation (1 K. 12:6-11)
- 3. Rehoboam's reply (1 K. 12:12-15)
- 4. Israel's rebellion (1 K. 12:16-20)
- 5. Rehoboam's reaction (1 K. 12:21-24)

Applications for Today

- 1. Good leaders will listen to the people and do what is best for the people, not for themselves (1 K. 12:5, 16; 2 Chron. 10:15-16; Prov. 14:28).
- 2. Be careful from whom you get your counsel and don't be so quick to dismiss the counsel of older, wiser men (1 K. 12:6-11; Prov. 11:14; 12:15; 15:22; 20:18; 24:6).
- 3. Be careful not to let your peers give you bad advice (1 K. 12:6-11; 2 Sam. 15:1-37; Prov. 12:5).

Applications for Today

- 4. A kingdom, city, or house divided against itself cannot stand (1 K. 12:16-19; Mt. 12:25).
- 5. Following bad counsel leads to further problems and bad ideas (1 K. 12:18-19, 21; 2 Sam. 17:1-29; Isa. 19:11).
- 6. God's word always comes true (1 K. 12:15; 2 Chron. 10:15; Mt. 5:18; 1 Pet. 1:25).

Applications for Today

7. God works "behind the scenes" in the affairs of men to bring about his plans for his people (1 K. 12:15, 24; 2 Chron. 10:15; 11:4; Josh. 11:20; Judg. 14:4; Prov. 21:1).
