- 3. What miracles did Paul perform on this island (28:7-10)?
- 4. What did the brethren from Rome do when they met Paul (28:11-15)?
- 5. What were Paul's living conditions when he got to Rome (28:16; see also v. 20, 23, 30)?
- 6. What part of Paul's past did he report to the chief Jews in Rome (28:17-20)?
- 7. How did these Jews respond to Paul's report (28:21-22)?
- 8. What did Paul preach to the Jews in Rome and what was their response (28:23-24)?
- 9. What word did Paul speak to these Jews before they departed (28:25-28)?
- 10. How long was Paul in Rome and how did he spend his time there (28:30-31)?

Digging Deeper

- 1. Where are the following located: the island of Melita (28:1), Syracus (28:12), Rhegium and Puteoli (28:13), the Market of Appius and the Three Taverns (28:15), and Rome (28:16).
- 2. What is the "hope of Israel" that Paul speaks of in 28:20?
- 3. What is a "sect" and what (or who) does it refer to in 28:22?
- 4. What scripture from Isaiah did Paul quote to the Jews (28:25-27)?
- 5. What four epistles of Paul did he write during his two-year imprisonment in Rome (28:30-31)?
- 6. What three epistles of Paul did he write after he was released from this Roman imprisonment and before his death?

Applications for Today

- 1. If unbelievers can show kindness, surely we as Christians can show kindness to others (28:1-10; Gal. 5:22; 6:10; Col. 3:12; 1 Pet. 4:9; 2 Pet. 1:7).
- 2. Meeting with faithful brethren makes us thankful and gives us courage (28:14-15; 2 Cor. 7:16).
- 3. A Christian can be bound physically, but not allow the gospel to be bound (28:16, 30-31; 2 Tim. 2:9).
- 4. Christians are often spoken against (28:22; 1 Pet. 2:12; 3:16; 4:14-16).
- 5. Use scriptural arguments to tell others about God and Jesus (28:23; Lk. 24:26-27, 44).

- 6. Preaching the truth often brings positive and negative responses (28:24; Acts 13:42-51; 14:2-4; 17:4-5, 32-34; 18:6-8; 19:8-9).
- 7. When some people don't want the truth; don't give up; find others who do (28:25-28; Mt. 10:14).
- 8. Preach and teach to whomever you can and do so with all boldness (28:30-31; 2 Cor. 3:12; Eph. 6:19).
- 9. God will make opportunities for faithful Christians to proclaim his word without hindrance or being forbidden (28:31; Col. 4:3)
