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538/37 B.C. first return of the Jews under Zerubbabel (Ezra 1-2)
537/36 B.C. the altar built and the foundation laid (Ezra 3)
536/15-520 B.C. the work on the temple ceases (Ezra 4)
520 B.C. the preaching of Haggai (1-2) and Zechariah (1-6)
520 B.C. the temple construction resumes (Ezra 5)
518 B.C. the preaching of Zechariah (Zechariah 7-14)
516/15 B.C. the temple is completed (Ezra 6)
486 B.C. the Jews opposed in the beginning of Xerxes (Ezra 4:6)
483 B.C. Xerxes holds a feast (Esther 1)
479 B.C. Esther is made queen (Esther 2)
474/73 B.C. Haman plans to kill the Jews (Esther 3-10)
464-423 B.C. the Jews opposed in Artaxerxes' reign (Ezra 4:7ff)
458/57 B.C. the second return of the Jews under Ezra (Ezra 7-10)
445-433 B.C. Nehemiah returns & rebuilds the walls (Neh. 1-12)
433-432 B.C. Nehemiah's recall and return (Nehemiah 13)
432-425 B.C. the preaching of Malachi (1-4)

7 Reforms in the Book of Malachi

- 1. Stop doubting the Lord's love (1:2-5)
- 2. Stop offering polluted sacrifices to the Lord (1:6-14)
- 3. Stop failing to teach and obey God's law (2:1-9)
- 4. Stop divorcing and remarrying (2:10-16)
- 5. Stop saying that everyone who does evil is good (2:17)
- 6. Stop robbing God by not bringing the whole tithe (3:7-12)
- 7. Stop saying it is vain to serve the Lord (3:13-15)

- 1. Hearing and doing God's law is what is important (13:1-3; Jas. 1:22-25).
- 2. Do not have fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness (13:4-9; Eph. 5:11).
- 3. Get personally involved in restoring God's people to what is right (13:8; [note the many "I"s in this chapter]; Gal. 6:1).

- 4. Do not neglect to give your offering (13:10-13; Mal. 3:8-13; 2 Cor. 9:6-7).
- 5. Faithful (trustworthy) men and women are needed today to do the Lord's work (13:13; 2 Chron. 34:12; 2 Tim. 2:2)
- 6. God will remember the good works of his faithful people (13:14; Heb. 6:10).

- 7. Let your requests be made known to God (13:14, 22, 29, 31; Phil. 4:6).
- 8. Don't repeat the same sins of the past (13:18; Prov. 26:11).
- 9. You can be a great person, but still be made to sin because of the evil influences that you choose to be around (13:26; 1 Cor. 15:33).

- 10. Marrying a non-Christian is authorized by New Testament law, but not wise (13:23-27; 1 Cor. 7:12-16).
- 11. It takes great courage and concern like Nehemiah to make necessary reforms among God's people (13:6-31; 1 Cor. 16:13; Phil. 1:27-28; 2 Tim. 1:7).

Leadership Qualities in Nehemiah 13

- 1. Base all your reforms on the word of God (13:1-3)
- 2. Know that a lack of good leadership will often lead to problems among the people (13:4-6)
- 3. Have the courage and conviction to get personally involved ("I") in changing others (13:6-31)
- 4. Be proactive when you see or hear something, do something (13:7, 10, 15, 23)

Leadership Qualities in Nehemiah 13

- 5. Sometimes you have to know the personal lives of people when they are not living right (13:6-31)
- 6. Be grieved when something with God's people is not right (13:8)
- 7. Pray to God regularly (3:14, 22, 29, 31)
- 8. Be firm and take drastic measures when necessary to stop any wrong-doing (13:11, 15, 17, 19-22, 25, 28)

Leadership Qualities in Nehemiah 13

9. Good leaders follow God's word; they don't follow what ungodly people are doing (13:27)
