Applications for Today

- 1. Hope saves when it causes the Christian to patiently endure suffering and wait for the reward of heaven (8:24-25).
- 2. Both the Holy Spirit (8:26) and Jesus Christ (8:34) intercede for Christians during times of suffering. This should give Christians great encouragement.
- 3. Christians must be conformed to the image of Jesus Christ (8:29).
- 4. Let us endure our suffering knowing that God will deliver us and reward us in the end (8:35).
- 5. Faithful Christians need to face their trials as "more than conquerors," not as defeated losers (8:37). External forces in life may be strong but they cannot separate the faithful Christian from God (8:38).
- Christians have hope (8:18-25), help from the Holy Spirit (8:26-27), divine providence (8:28-30), and God's assurance (8:31-39) to get them through times of suffering. What encouragement!
