3. Define these words as they relate to the Christian's duty toward civil government: "tribute," "custom," "fear," and "honor" (13:7).
4. When Paul writes "owe no man anything" (13:8), is he talking about borrowing money, credit debt, installment plans, etc.?
5. Where in the Old Testament are the commandments of verse 9 found?
6. "Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself," is found where in the Old Testament (13:9)?
7. In what way is love a "fulfillment" of the law and what "law" is referred to here (13:8,10)?

- 8. What do "sleep," "night," and "darkness" refer to in verses 11 and 12?
- 9. Where else in the New Testament does Paul write about the Christian's "armor" (13:12)?
- 10. Define these words found in verse 13: "becomingly" ("honestly," KJV), "reveling" ("rioting," KJV), "drunkenness," "chambering," "wantonness," "strife," and "jealously" ("envying," KJV).
- 11. How does a Christian "put on" the Lord Jesus Christ (13:14) when he has already "put on" Christ in baptism (Romans 6:3; Gal. 3:27)?
