- 4. What responsibility do brethren have toward themselves concerning personal scruples (14:5)?
- 5. What two specific personal scruples does Paul address in verses 2 through 6?
- 6. Why did Christ die and rise again (14:9)?
- 7. Where will we all stand at the end of time and what will we all do then (4:10-11)?
- 8. What account will be given in the Judgment Day and to whom (14:12)?

• Digging Deeper

1. Who are the "weak" and who are the "strong" in this chapter (14:1; see also 15:1)?

- 2. What does "faith" refer to in this context (14:1-2,22,23)?
- 3. What does "judge" refer to in this context (14:3,4,10,13,22)?
- 4. What Old Testament scripture is quoted in verse 11?
- 5. What is Paul's purpose in speaking about the Judgment Day in this context (14:10-12)?
- 6. Where else in the NT does Paul discuss the matter of personal conscience and liberty?
- 7. What Bible matters are not under consideration in Romans 14?
- 8. What was the social makeup (Jew / Gentile) of church membership at Rome and how does this relate to what Paul discusses in Romans 14?

• Applications for Today

- 1. Not every Christian has a strong conscience about some personal matters of scruple. Brethren in local churches must be willing to work with each other and not bind personal scruples upon one another (14:1-6).
- 2. We do not live selfishly for our own good. We live for the Lord too (14:7-9).
