New Testament Lessons from Noah's Ark

Jesus referred to Noah's ark. He said,

"And as were the days of Noah, so shall be the coming of the Son of man. ³⁸ For as in those days which were before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day that Noah entered into the ark, ³⁹ and they knew not until the flood came, and took them all away; so shall be the coming of the Son of man" (Matthew 24:37-39; see also Luke 17:26-27).

The key lesson that Jesus was trying to teach using Noah's ark was a lesson in preparation. We need to be prepared for the coming of Jesus just like Noah was prepared for the coming flood.

The author of Hebrews referred to Noah's ark. He wrote,

"By faith Noah, being warned of God concerning things not seen as yet, moved with godly fear, prepared an ark to the saving of his house; through which he condemned the world, and became heir of the righteousness which is according to faith" (Hebrews 11:7). The key lesson that the author of Hebrews was trying to make was a lesson on obedient faith. It takes an obedient faith in God's word and warning to be saved.

The apostle Peter referred to Noah's ark. He wrote,

"in which also he went and preached unto the spirits in prison, ²⁰ that aforetime were disobedient, when the longsuffering of God waited in



the days of Noah, while the ark was a preparing, wherein few, that is, eight souls, were saved through water" (1 Peter 3:20-21).

"and spared not the ancient world, but preserved Noah with seven others, a preacher of righteousness, when he brought a flood upon the world of the ungodly" (2 Peter 2:5).

The key lesson that Peter was trying to make was a lesson in the few people

who are saved. Few are travelling the narrow road to salvation and many are travelling the broad road to damnation.

Noah's Ark and Christ's Church

There are many comparisons that could be made between Noah and his family in the ark and Christians in the Lord's church. The ark was the way that Noah and his family could be saved from coming judgement and the New Testament church of Christ is the way that all can be saved today from coming judgment. Consider a few comparisons here:
